

# Yeates, Kolendich Pace ISU Victory

The ISU wrestling team turned in its biggest win of the young season by romping over Weber State College to the tune of 37-0 Friday night.

Paced by Rick Yeates, Frank Kolendich and Jessie Eddy the Bengals claimed wins in every match, and added to forfeits or the win.

Kolendich, floored Weber's Greg Robinson after only 25 seconds in the first round, while Yeates also turned in a win with 24 seconds remaining in the second period.

Other Bengal wrestlers who looked impressive during the dual meet included John Andrews, Ray Schnabel and Leroy Harris. Andrews, a returning letterman, decisioned Weber's Cliff Martin, 11-4, while Schnabel turned in a 15-7 decision over Wildcat grappler Gaylord Gooch. Harris finished out the meet gaining a 7-1 decision over Ed Anderson on the Wildcats. Sporting a 2-0 season record,

the Bengal matmen turned to the University of Utah at Salt Lake tonight, and host Portland State College Friday afternoon. Friday's meet will get underway at 2 p.m. in the ISU gymnasium.

It was the debut for ISU wrestling coach Earl Lynn.

The powerful Idaho State University Varsity wrestling squad didn't lose a match to Boise College Saturday afternoon and rolled to a 31-2 victory over the Broncos.

The only way the Broncos were able to hit the scoring column was when ex-state champ Larry Macomb drew with ISU's Ron Schnabel, 1-1, in the 152-pound class. Other than that it was all Bengal wins.

One of the days top matches wasn't counted in the final tabulations. In an exhibition match, ISU's Alan Takahashi of Parma drew with the Bronco's Steve Jensen from Boise, 4-4. The two wrestlers were both state champions last year in the same weight class but different divisions.

The loss for the Broncos was their third in three outings. They lost previously to Eastern Oregon College and Treasure Valley Community College.

## Utah Wrestlers Beat ISU 25-13

Idaho State University dropped a 25-13 decision to the University of Utah in a dual meet Friday at the ISU gym.

The Bengals, who looked considerably stronger this time than in their earlier meet with Utah, spotted the Utah wrestlers three forfeits.

Bengal grapplers Fred Rodriguez, Rick Yates and Jesse Eddy all turned in formidable wins during the evening.

Rodriguez decisioned Utah's Rich Castile 8-6 in the 123-pound class while Eddy decisioned opponent Larry Clark of Utah 7-1 in the 167-pound category.

Yates, the defending Big Sky Conference champion in the 130-pound class, wrestled in the 137-pound weight class and pinned Utah's Jack Marshall with 1:31 left on the clock in the second round.

The Bengals travel to Logan next Friday to meet the Aggies of Utah State and will return home February 3 to host Washington State University of Pullman.

Washington State is one of the top collegiate wrestling teams on the west coast.

The Bengals now post a season record of 2-3.

## ISU Wrestlers Enter BSAC Meet in Ogden

Idaho State University will enter a full squad of wrestlers in the second annual Big Sky Athletic Conference meet at Ogden this Saturday and the Bengals' main objective is to finish higher than their fourth place effort a year ago.

"We feel that at least three or four kids on the team could win all the marbles, and at any rate the battle for the team championship should be much closer than last year when Montana State College won it with ease," Bengal coach Bob Beeten said.

Beeten said he has added three new faces on the ISU roster in order to take a full team to Ogden. Freshman Richard Hooban is slated to hold down the 137-pound berth, senior Roger Michener has been added at 167, and junior Ben Miller has volunteered to wrestle at 177.

Michener, a lad who has also tried his hand at football and track with the Bengals, has had two matches this season but neither Hooban or Miller has seen competition.

Waylan Vance, 123-pound junior and former national jaycee champ, carries the top record for the Bengals with a season mark of five wins, no losses and two ties.

Freshman Rick Yeates, 130-pounder, has a fine 8-1-0 record and senior Bud Johnson sports a 5-1-0 slate. Johnson should be one of the favorites to grab the 191-pound title, Beeten believes.

Other Big Sky entries for Idaho State will be freshman Fred Rodriguez in the 115-pound bracket, either Gary Huff or Louis Hooban at 147, Bob Huff, 157, and John Porter, heavyweight.

The Bengals compiled a season dual meet record of 4-7-0.

## Down Bengals

Montana State's wrestlers copped their second victory over Idaho State this season with a 23-11 triumph over the Bengals Friday afternoon in the ISU gym.

Both squads won three matches and drew one, but the Bobcats took forfeits at 147 and 177 pounds.

Wayland Vance, ISU, and Jim Lookwood, MSC, opened the card with a draw in the 123-pound division.

Bengal Rick Yates decisioned Fred Zadick of MSC in the 130-pound class and Bobcat Ken Kershner decisioned Gary Huff ISU, in the 137-pound division.

Montana State moved out in front in the point chase in the 147-pound class when Fred Schaffer won by forfeit. The Bengals bounced back with victory when 157-pounder, Bob Huff, decisioned Mike Hoveva.

The Bobcats took the next two. Roger Pederson, MSC, beat Roger Michener and Jerry Miller won by forfeit.

At 191, Bud Johnson of Idaho State decisioned Roger Anderson and MSC's heavyweight Kaschlepp pinned John Porter.
